



H1N1 Flu Clinics

Dear Parents:

An H1N1 Flu clinic will be held at **Schoolcraft Middle School on Monday, February 8th from 3:00 to 6:00pm**. H1N1 is still circulating in the community and another wave of illness may hit in the coming months. Vaccinating your family now will help keep them healthy and avoid lost days of school and work.

- The vaccine is **FREE** to everyone.
- Everyone is encouraged to receive the vaccine and clinics are open to all.
- Healthy individuals between the ages of 2-49 will qualify for the nasal FluMist version of the vaccine – it's simple and painless.
- Children and adults with asthma and other health conditions will not qualify for the FluMist and will receive the shot version of the vaccine.
- Children age 9 and under need two doses of the vaccine spaced at least 28 days apart.
- Clinics are being offered at other locations and you are encouraged to attend a clinic which is most convenient to you. See below for a schedule of all clinics that are currently scheduled.
